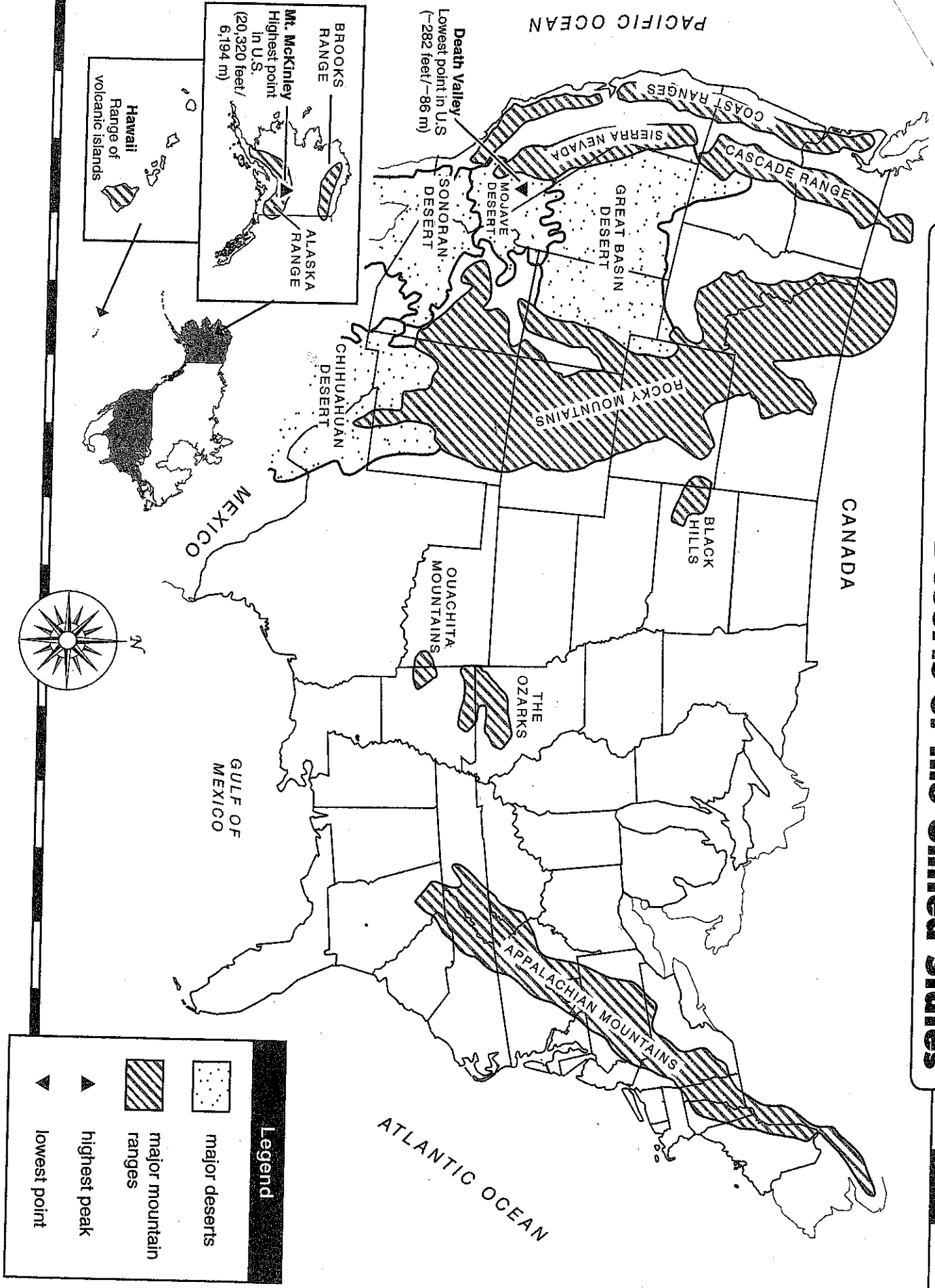

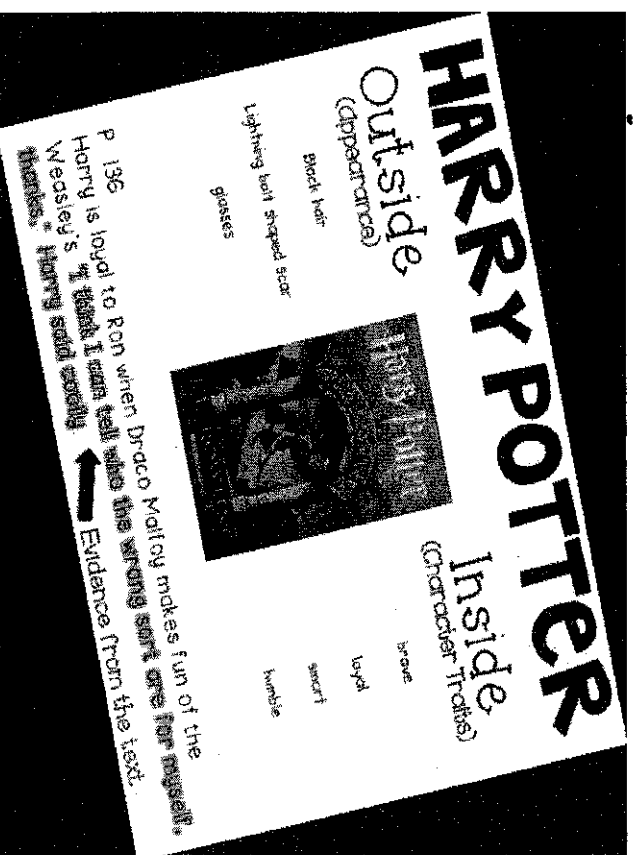
Analyze a Character
